



JOB DESCRIPTION - Secondary School Teacher

Subject: Language and Literature - American International Section

I. INSTITUTIONAL CONTEXT

The Lycée Français Blaise Pascal operates on two distinct campuses and accommodates approximately 2,670 students:

- 1,010 students at the Jacques Prévert Primary School (from Pre-K to Grade 5)
- 1,610 students in the middle and high school

It also hosts around fifty students in a scientific preparatory class, most of whom come from the Ivorian education system.

The school's academic offerings include an American International Section (SIA) and a European Section. It prepares students for the following diplomas:

- Diplôme National du Brevet (DNB) and the International Option of the Brevet (DNBi)
- French General Baccalauréat
- French International Baccalauréat (BFI)

The school is managed by a non-profit organization under Ivorian law (the AGBP – Association Gestionnaire du Iycée Blaise Pascal) and has a partnership agreement with the AEFE (Agency for French Education Abroad). It is accredited by the French Ministry of Education from Pre-K through 12th grade. The scientific preparatory class (in partnership with Grenoble INP) is not accredited.

The school also houses the *SCE* (*Examinations Coordination Service*), responsible for managing exam logistics for Côte d'Ivoire, Mali, and Burkina Faso.





II. MAIN DUTIES AND REQUIRED COMPETENCIES

A. Main Duties

The position includes four main responsibilities:

- Teaching (classroom instruction)
- Teaching-related activities: lesson planning and research, student assessment and support, academic guidance, participation in teaching and interdisciplinary teams, communication with parents.
- Complementary duties: specific responsibilities supporting student-centered educational projects.
- Exam responsibilities: writing exam papers, invigilating exams, grading, and participating in juries.

B. Required Competencies

- Native English speaker (or educated in the U.S. system) with at least basic proficiency in French
- Mastery of the Language and Literature curriculum of the U.S. education system
- Knowledge of the official Language and Literature programs for the American International Section in middle and high school
- For teaching in SIA or the European Section, experience in CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) and English proficiency (minimum B2) is a plus
- In the absence of official textbooks, the teacher will develop course materials inspired by the AAMIS framework in collaboration with the SIA team

III. SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS FOR OVERSEAS POSITIONS

- High availability, especially to students and families
- Strong autonomy and adaptability
- Willingness to adjust schedules in response to school needs and activity peaks

 - o Bachelor's Degree in Language and Literature

• International teaching certifications (e.g. IB Certificate in Teaching and Learning for the International Baccalaureate)
